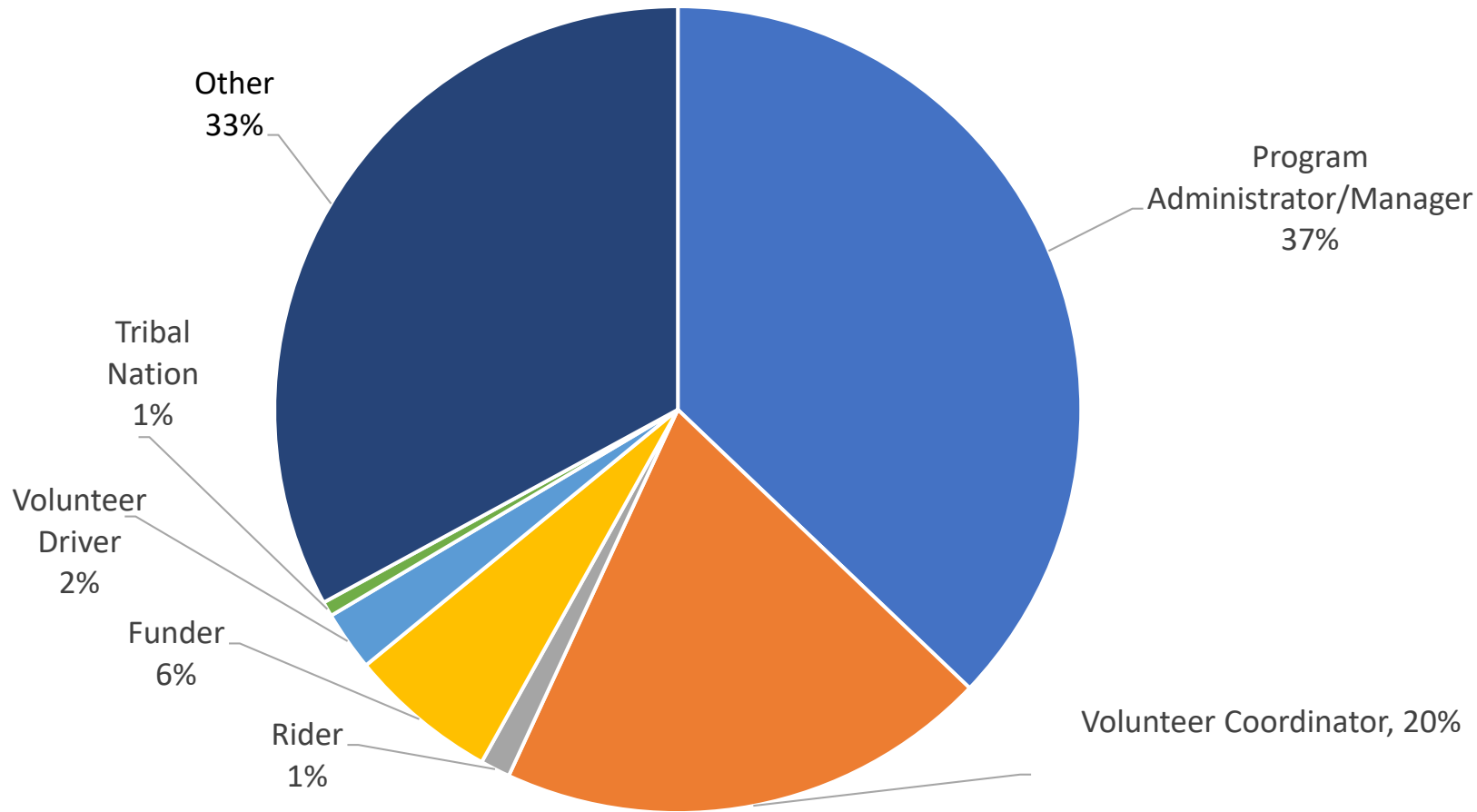

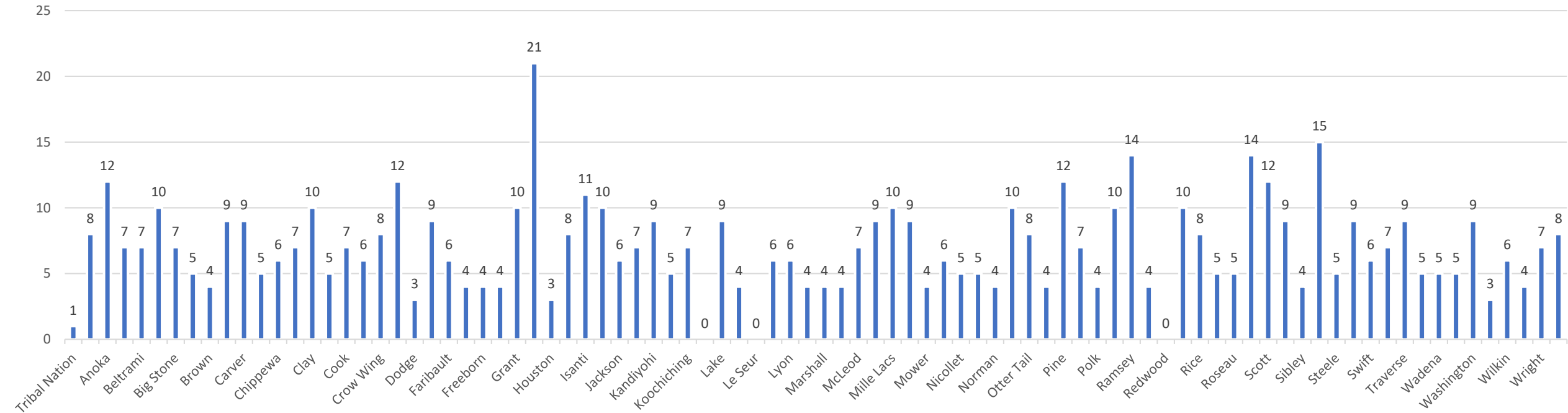

Current state of Volunteer Driver Programs

- Pre – COVID 19:
 - Volunteer Drivers were critical link in the transportation delivery system in Minnesota
 - However in the last twenty years the demand for their services has increased significantly, yet the pool of Volunteer Drivers available to do services has decreased by over 50%
 - The reasons vary from retirees staying in the work force
 - The cost of insurance
 - The tax disincentive
 - Mileage reimbursement rate

Current state of Volunteer Driver Programs (continued)

- COVID 19:
 - Volunteer Drivers programs were nearly 100% shutdown the first 3 months of the Pandemic, and/or were shifting to mostly food access delivery systems
 - With average age of a Volunteer Driver at 74 years, the drivers' themselves were the population at most risk to COVID 19
 - The shift to mostly food access, with no people trips has raised the access question to a new level
 - We have been creative and will continue to be

Future of Volunteer Driver Programs

- Post COVID-19:
 - We are projecting Volunteer Drivers programs were nearly 100% shutdown the first 3 months (March through May) of the pandemic
 - With average age of a volunteer driver at 74 years, the drivers' themselves were the population at most risk
 - The shift to mostly food access, with no people has raised the “access” question to a new level
 - What is role of the Volunteer Driver Programs moving forward?

Volunteer Drivers: The Critical Link

- Volunteer Drivers do the critical link:
 - taking a Veteran to the VA, or
 - taking your elderly neighbor to the Doctor, or
 - taking children in the foster care system to see their parents, or
 - delivering meals to COVID 19 quarantined patients at home, or
 - taking a Medical Assistance client to cancer treatments,
 - All this and much more

Volunteer Drivers are a priority

- Volunteer Drivers are a critical link in our transportation system, it is now more than ever our priority that Volunteer Driver Programs are successful and supported
 - As our population is aging and becoming ever more transportation challenged
 - As our various communities struggle for more access to services
 - As our economy will begin the process to recovery, many will need transportation services to facilitate that progress

Volunteer Drivers are a priority (continued)

- In 2018 the Minnesota Volunteer Driver Coalition 85 members reported:
 - Over 168,000 rides
 - Serving 77,474 people
 - Driving over 9.5 million miles
- And this only accounts for the members of Coalition, there are many more Volunteer Driver programs, many more rides, miles driven and people getting served and needing to be served

Who is MCOTA?

The Minnesota Council on Transportation Access (MCOTA) was established by the Minnesota Legislature in 2010 (Minn. Statute 2010 174.285) to "study, evaluate, oversee, and make recommendations to improve the coordination, availability, accessibility, efficiency, cost-effectiveness, and safety of transportation services provided to the transit public."

MCOTA

I am one of 14 state agency members, specifically representing the Governor's Office.

Since my tenure at the July 2020 MCOTA Commissioners annual meeting where the Council approved legislation to be included in the Governor's FY 2022-23 policy and budget proposal.

The Governor's Office is in the process of evaluating policy and budget proposals for inclusion in the final biennial budget, which will be released in late January.

Please join us at the December 9th, 2020 Forum on Volunteer Driver Policy where this will be discussed and reviewed.

Thank you, as Suzanne noted the MCOTA's approval of legislative language to address the definition what is a Volunteer Driver, or specifically a volunteer driver is not "for Hire". This is important definition for Insurance and the tax implications.

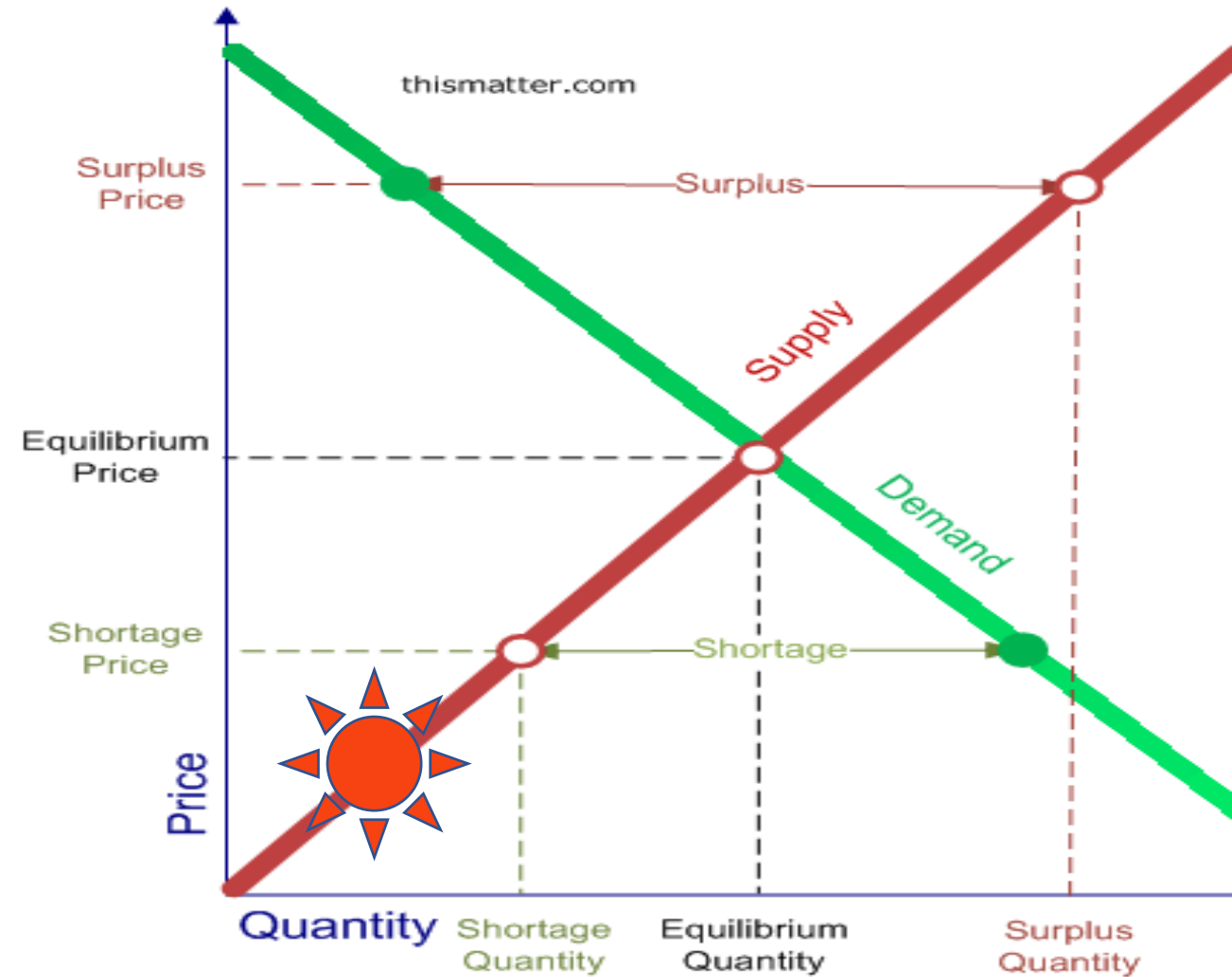

- **Pricing** is hidden to users



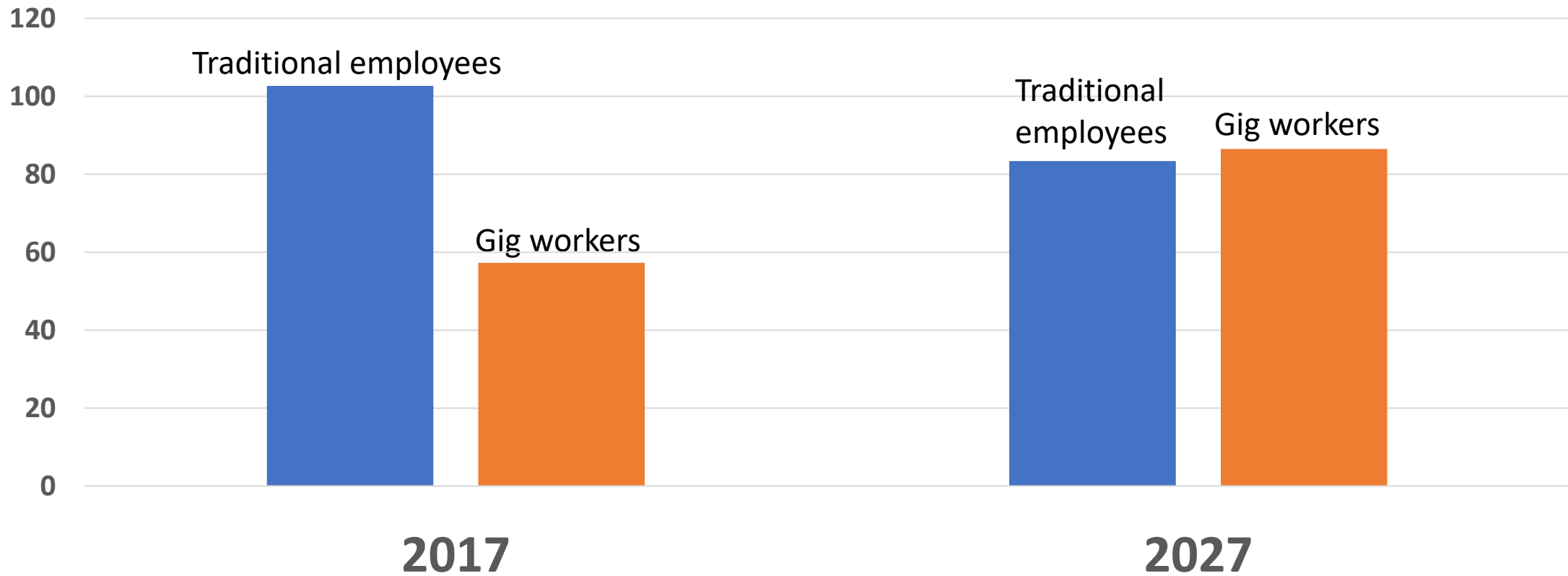
Gig Economy
